- Ask Electrical Connections if your home would benefit from AFCI protection, especially during inspections of older homes or upgrades to electrical systems. These advanced new safety devices recognize dangerous conditions that are not detected by standard breakers.
- Test smoke detectors and AFCIs monthly to ensure that they are working properly.
- Establish an evacuation plan that can be used in case of an emergency, and practice with your family.
- Use light bulbs that match the recommended wattage on the light fixture. Do NOT USE CFL BULBS!
- In homes with young children, install tamper resistant receptacles to prevent electrical shocks and burns.
- Let us conduct a basic assessment of your home electrical system, electrical cords, extension cords, power plugs, and outlets.
- Look for telltale signs of electrical problems such as dim and flickering lights, unusual sizzling and buzzing sounds from your electrical system, insulation and circuit breakers that trip repeatedly.
- Use extension cords only temporarily, and never with space heaters or air conditioners.

Savs...

BEFORE

Build an emergency kit.

Make a family communications plan.

Help your parents bring in outdoor items like potted plants, patio furniture, decorations, and garbage cans. They can fly in strong winds!

DURING

Don't open the refrigerator or freezer. In case you lose power, you want the cold air to stay in!

Stay away from windows and glass doors. They could break and hurt you.

Don't go outside when the rain or winds stop. This is the eye of the storm, or a short "rest," and it will start again.

If need be, stay inside a closet or a room without windows. You can also lie on the floor under a table or sturdy object. Listen to your parents or safety authorities for important instructions.



Don't go outside without a grown-up.

Don't go near any wires that are loose or dangling. They could electrocute you! Stay out of standing water, electrical lines may be under the water and could kill you! Do NOT play in flood waters!

Don't drink water from the faucet unless your parents say it's okay.

Text, don't talk. Unless there's a life-threatening situation, if you have a cell phone, send a text so that you don't tie up phone lines needed by emergency workers. Plus, texting may work even if cell service is down (yes, you can share this information with your parents)

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 1/2-2 lbs beef stew meat, less than 1 inch thick
- 2 tablespoons parsley, finely chopped
- 1/3 cup olive oil
- 1/2 small onion, grated
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 1 tablespoon vinegar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/4 teaspoon onion powder

- 1. Cut any large pieces of meat in half so they will cook faster. Then place the beef cubes in a medium bowl. Chop the parsley & add it to the beef, set aside to be used later.
- 2. Pour the olive oil in a small glass bowl. Add the spices, vinegar & tomato paste, stir until well blended. Grate the onion & add it
- 3. Stir the mixture in with the beef until it is well coated. Cover with a lid & place in the refrigerator to marinate for at least 2
- 4. Place the beef on skewers, leaving a little gap between each piece. Grill on each side until the meat is no longer pink inside, between 10-15 minutes.
- 5. Serve with thick bread instead of utensils. (Moroccans eat most of their food with their right hand, using only bread to scoop up the meal).
